

MARCH IS CHURCH ELBOW MONTH

Do you know the most important body part for helping our church grow? Some people might say the mouth or the heart. Both of those are important, and in fact there is definitely some heart work involved, and we use our voices, too. The most important body part for helping our church grow, though, is the elbow.

The elbow, you ask? Absolutely so! Have you ever been to a wedding or other event where the usher offers you an elbow as he shows you to your seat? Have you ever had a child grab your hand or elbow as you show them where to go? Have you ever guided a blind person through a building or across a street while he or she holds onto your elbow?

So it is that the most important part of our body for bringing someone to church is our elbow. We can talk about our church. We can share testimonies and stories about Jesus Christ. Those of us who are so inclined can quote Scripture all day long. The best way to get someone to church, though, is to offer an elbow. That means not just saying, "Please come," but, "Please come WITH ME. I'll stop by your home on Sunday morning to lead you," or, "I'll meet you in the parking lot and you can sit WITH ME."

April 2nd will be our first "Invitation Sunday" at Peralta Memorial UMC. It will be the day to use our elbows. However, before we use our elbows, we will warm up our hearts and our voices. Throughout the month of March I will be asking everyone to pray about three people each of us knows who do not go to church anywhere and who God wants us to invite to church on April 2nd. In worship this Sunday, March 5th, we will all receive cards for writing down the names of our three people to invite. Each week of the month we will warm up our hearts, voices, and elbows, praying for these people and preparing to invite them. We will ask God's blessing on them.

Will all three people who are on our card come on April 2nd? Maybe or maybe not, but some will. God will touch the hearts of some and our elbows will be strong. Maybe for some people, our invitation will be the first seed planted toward a relationship with Christ, and that seed will grow on God's own time in ways we may or may not see. Nonetheless, we will be doing God's work in a mighty way.



Hymn History



“His Eye is on the Sparrow” – 1905

“Are not two sparrows sold for a copper coin? And not one of them falls to the ground apart from your Father’s will.”
Matthew 10:29

Most people have a hobby of some sort to provide a healthy diversion from the rigors of work. Long ago, there was a woodworker in Nazareth who counted bird-watching among His diversions. We can make that assumption because Jesus later referred frequently to birdlife in His sermons, saying things such as:

- “Are not two sparrows sold for a copper coin? And not one of them falls to the ground apart from your Father’s will.” (Matthew 10:29)
- “Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?” (Matthew 6:26)
- “Consider the ravens...” (Luke 12:24)
- “Do not fear...you are of more value than many sparrows.” (Luke 12:7)

It was this theme that caused the author of “God Will Take Care of You: to write, a year later, another great hymn on God’s care: “His Eye Is on the Sparrow.”

Civilla Durfee Martin was a Canadian by birth, born on August 21, 1869, in Nova Scotia. She became a school and music teacher, but when she married Dr. Walter Martin, an evangelist, she gave up teaching to travel with him and assist in his meetings.

This is her account of the writing of his song:

Early in the spring of 1905, my husband and I were sojourning in Elmira, New York. We contracted a deep friendship for a couple by the name of Mr. and Mrs. Doolittle—true saints of God. Mrs. Doolittle had been bedridden for nigh twenty years. Her husband was an incurable cripple who had to propel himself to and from his business in a wheel chair. Despite their afflictions, they lived happy Christian lives, bringing inspiration and comfort to all who knew them. One day while we were visiting with the Doolittles, my husband commented on their bright hopefulness and asked them for the secret of it. Mrs. Doolittle’s reply was simple: “His eye is on the sparrow, and I know He watches me.” The beauty of this simple expression of boundless faith gripped the hearts and fired the imagination of Dr. Martin and me. The hymn “His Eye Is on the Sparrow” was the outcome of that experience.”

The day after writing the song, she mailed it to the famous gospel composer Charles Gabriel, who penned the music.

AfterShock - Youth Group


" Turning the hearts of youth and families to God and each other "

Light Night is quickly becoming one of the "High-Lights" (see what I just did there) of youth group. We meet on the third Sunday of the month, unless it falls on a holiday, then it's on the fourth Sunday. We meet in the Sanctuary from 6:30 till 8pm and start off with a contemplative exercise to help us learn how to quiet our minds and spirit from all the business and distractions of the world. As you can imagine, it is not normal for people, much less teens, in today's world to stay calm and quiet for 15 to 30 minutes and work at taking every thought captive. 
