ADVENT

Have you ever had a deep longing inside of you? Have you ever wanted God to speak to you so badly that the longing and discomfort manifest inside of you and outside of you? Have you ever searched for words and been unable to find them? Have you had sighs, longings, and groanings too deep to be able to express them?

That's been my Advent so far. God is getting ready to do something great and big. I can feel it. I want to be part of it. I'm just not sure what it is yet.

The strange part is that all is humming along in my life swimmingly. There have been some amazingly beautiful moments of ministry at Peralta in the past month. Life is good and happy. Our kids are doing great. So why the discontent?

God is knocking me out of my comfort zone. God is pushing me somewhere I've never been before. God is using me in a mighty way, but it's making me uncomfortable and it's making others around me uncomfortable.

I can't stand it when God makes me uncomfortable. I'd rather go about my own way. I'd like to move forward and make amazing things happen. I want to go and kick some butt for God. I want to make great things happen – to be the change, make the difference, and push forward.

Yet here I sit, as uncomfortable as ever. I guess I'll spend more time in prayer. Please don't tell me it's all OK. Please don't tell me it will all get better. I just need to sit in the discomfort.

Because God is breaking me open. God is getting ready to do something wonderful. Isn't that what Advent is all about? Preparation. Watching. Waiting. Hoping. If you've ever been in such an uncomfortable spiritual spot, my prayer is that you don't smooth over the discomfort. Live there for a little while because sometimes God has to break us open to get to the really good stuff inside and to rebuild us. Sometimes God has to break the hardened shell around us. I wonder what hardened parts of me need to be broken away.

I remember attending a Catholic mass in December, and after singing many Christmas carols and much Advent festivity the priest ended with this benediction, "May the Holy Spirit disturb you." I don't think that's what any of us wanted or expected to hear. Yet those words have stuck with me for many years. This Advent season of preparation, watching, and expecting, may the Holy Spirit disturb us and break us open so that God can rebuild something new and amazing.

Hymn History

Hark! The Herald Angels Sing-1739

"Then the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will, be to all people." Luke 2:10

Upon his conversion, Charles Wesley immediately began writing hymns, each one packed with doctrine, all of them exhibiting strength and sensitivity, both beauty and theological brawn. He wrote constantly, and even on horseback his mind was flooded with new songs. He often stopped at houses along the road and ran in asking for "pen and ink."

He wrote more than six thousand hymns during his life, and he didn't like people tinkering with the words. In one of his hymnals, he wrote, "I beg leave to mention a thought which has been long upon my mind, and which I should long ago have inserted in the public papers, had I not been unwilling to stir up a nest of hornets. Many gentlemen have done my brother and me (though without naming us) the honor to reprint many of our hymns. Now they are perfectly welcome to do so, provided they print them just as they are. But I desire they would not attempt to mend them, for they are really no able. None of them is able to mend either the sense of the verse. Therefore, I must beg of them these two favors: either to let them stand just as they are, to take things for better or worse, or to add the true reading in the margin, or at the bottom of the page, that we may no longer be accountable either for the nonsense of for the doggerel of other men."

But one man did the church a great favor by polishing up one of Charles's best-loved hymns. When Charles was 32, he wrote a Christmas hymn that began:

Hark, how all the welkin rings,

"Glory to the King of kings;

Peace on earth, and mercy mild,

God and sinners reconciled!"

Joyful, all ye nations, rise,

Join the triumph of the skies;

Universal nature say,

"Christ the Lord is born to-day!"

The word welkin was an old English term for "the vault of heaven." It was Charles's friend, evangelist George Whitfield, who, when he published this carol in his collection of hymns in 1753, changed the words to the now beloved "Hark! The Herald Angel Sing,"

Operation Christmas Child

Thank you so much for your prayers and for your support the seven years Mike and I have co-chaired the ministry of Operation Christmas Child (aka the Shoeboxes). We have had a great time, but it is time to hand the reins over to someone else, and if you are *kinda* thinking this is a ministry y



someone else, and if you are *kinda* thinking this is a ministry you might like to lead, here's a <u>Readers' Digest</u> version of our journey.

- Year one—I was introduced to the shoebox ministry by Janice Knowlton. I got my first box. I put it someplace safe.
- Year two—I filled the box *from the previous year*. But I missed the official deadline for getting it turned in! Janice said if I got it to her before her bedtime that last day, she'd take it. I went to her home, and she had me plop my box atop the dozens she had scattered about the front room.
- Year three—two boxes. One for each of our grandsons. The boys filled them with goodies they would like to have received. I got them turned in on time.
- Then, one day, we received the devastating news that Janice had passed away, and her passing left a void at the head of many ministries here. One by one, people stepped up, and, I grabbed the shoeboxes.
- From that first shoebox that I didn't get turned in until now, Mike and I have collected about 700 shoeboxes, one or both of us has volunteered at the collection center in Albuquerque every year preparing cartons for transport to the distribution center in Denver, we've met people who have actually hand-delivered boxes to children around the world, we've met amazing people with amazing stories of the days *they'd received* the little boxes that changed their lives forever, and we've even volunteered at the distribution center in Dallas (where we helped prepare over 20,000 boxes in 2 days for shipment to Ghana!).
- It's been a great 7 years filled with blessings but we need to step down.
