#### THE IDOLATRY OF BUSY-NESS

I've just returned from a wonderful trip to Ohio. On the trip we visited Melissa's grandmother and uncle, residents of Ohio. I also had the privilege to visit the church that sent me into ministry back in 2004, First Wayne Street UMC in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Also, I attended the National Conference of the Federation of Fire Chaplains which was held this year in Toledo.

We have many sayings among chaplains, but one of my favorites is, "Don't just do something; STAND THERE!" So often, we want to take action to fix things and make things right. Often the answer or solution seems blatantly obvious. We are trained, experienced, and knowledgeable. If only the people we were helping would do what we told them to, their life would be so much better.

The real, hard truth, though, is that my answer and solution might not be God's solution for the person I'm helping. My answer comes from my perspective and my experiences, and it may or may not be the right solution. As a representative of God, my work as a chaplain is to stand there, to listen, and to care. My job is to provide space for the holy work of God, but not to do the work for the person I am called to help.


Sometimes in the church we can get so busy trying to solve our problems that we fail to make space for the holy work of God. We can become human "doings" rather than human beings. As we try to solve problems from the knowledge and experience we have, we miss out on the love and life God has for us even though we are trying to do good. The good work becomes the enemy of the best opportunities God will only reveal to us if we devote time and energy to pray, listen, and discern.

So it is in the Bible with Mary and Martha, with Martha working hard to cook and clean while Mary sits at Jesus's feet. Jesus tells Martha, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her" (Luke 10:41-42).

As a church, may we intentionally seek the "better part" that Jesus describes. May we seek to know and follow Jesus, the gift and relationship that will never run out. May we not seek to store up treasures that will run out, wear out, or rust. May we do God's will and lead others to the greatest treasure of all – a life knowing, celebrating, and living into the love of God.



## Hymn History

We Gather Together-1597

"So the nations shall fear the name of the Lord, and all the kings of the earth Your glory." Psalm 102:15

Those who have visited the Netherlands, with its picturesque dikes and windmills, may be unaware of the terrific struggle for religious freedom that took place there in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. In 1555, the Low Country was given to King Philip II of Spain by his father,



Emperor Charles V of Germany. Philip was an arch-Catholic, but the winds of Calvinistic Reformation had reached the Netherlands. Roman Catholic churches were plundered, and the authority of Spain was resisted. In 1557, King Philip sent the dreaded Duke of Alba (Fernando Alvarez de Toledo) to bring the Netherlands back into the pope's fold. He established a reign of terror during which ten thousand people were executed and another forty thousand exiled. His ruling counsel was called the "Council of Troubles," but it's better known to history as the "Blood Council." The bodies of thousands of people were hung in the streets and on the doorposts of houses. Alva didn't hesitate to massacre whole cities. An attack on Leiden was stopped only by cutting the dikes and flooding the countryside.

On January 6, 1579, the Catholic southern regions of the Netherlands (modern Belgium) declared their allegiance to Philip, but three weeks later the northern part (modern Holland) refused to submit to the Catholic rule of Spain. In 1581, Holland declared its independence, led by the courageous William of Orange. Holland was devastated by warfare, and in the process William was cut down by an assassin's dagger. But the brave nation would not be denied, and eventually Spain lost its hold on the Dutch Republic.

This hymn, "We Gather Together," which Americans associate with their Thanksgiving holiday, was actually written sometime in 1597 to celebrate Holland's freedom from Spain. Its author, an unknown Dutchman, was full of thanksgiving that his people were finally free from Spanish tyranny and free to worship as they chose. Notice how he expressed this theme in these three beautiful verses:

The wicked oppressing now cease from distressing...

...so from the beginning the fight we were winning; Thou, Lord, wast at our side, all glory be Thine!

We all do extol Thee, Thou Leader triumphant, And pray that Thou still our defender wilt be. Let Thy congregation escape tribulation: Thy Name be ever praised! O Lord, make us free!

Wow what a great start into the 2016-2017 LOGOS year. We have had new kids signing up each week since we started and now have 30 kids registered this year so far. We have had several donations already which are helping tremendously in several areas. One of those areas is our scholarships; this is so important to have because at LOGOS we believe that no child will ever be turned away due to financial reasons. THANKS to all who have donated to this ministry!

Our new LOGOS leaders are doing a fantastic job and leading our young ones very well with new and creative ideas in Bible Study and Worship Skills. The kids are also having a ball in Recreation which is their time to get to play at no one's expense. Family Time is just amazing this year as well. We have new Table Parents who are doing a terrific job with their Table Families and our tables are growing fast. We are up to 5 tables so far and they are all almost completely full so as we continue to grow we will be adding Table 6 very soon.

LOGOS is definitely unique in that our main goal is building strong Christian relationships with the kids and that is most definitely happening. It happens in various ways:

- Learning the kids' names and talking with them each week; really talking with them by getting to know them and their interests and then following up each week by asking them how things are going in their lives and discussing their interests with them.
- Being ever so patient. Yes there are behavioral issues at times but the premise of LOGOS is that all are
  Children of God and deserve to be treated as such. So we have to ask ourselves each week, how would
  Jesus handle this child that is misbehaving and it transforms how we interact with the children. It also
  transforms their behavior because they begin to realize that they are loved no matter what they do and
  their bad behavior becomes positive and good behavior.
- Leaders are prepared each week for their class; this is important because it lets the kids know that they are important enough for their leader to have their lesson planned out each week.

These are just a few of the ways we are building Christian relationships that are based on Kingdom of God living which is the arena we create where God's love is first each and every week, no matter where you are at LOGOS.

When children are separated from their loved ones because adults are incarcerated, many will struggle with feelings of abandonment, wondering if mom or dad will remember them this Christmas.

#### This is where Angel Tree comes in.

Last year, over 300,000 boys and girls received Christmas gifts from their incarcerated parents through Prison Fellowship's Angel Tree program. They were reminded that they are loved, both by their mom or dad in prison, and also by their Heavenly Father. "It is not uncommon that the Christmas gift that child receives from you, through the Angel Tree program this Christmas, will be the only Christmas gift they see, because, quite simply, the household can't otherwise afford it."

But the benefits of the Angel Tree program extend beyond the children. By connecting parents to their children, hearts are changed, and family ties are reconnected and strengthened. "I have seen few things soften the heart of a hardened criminal more than the realization that a complete stranger—on his or her behalf—went out, purchased a Christmas gift, and delivered it for him or her to his or her child."

When mom or dad is in prison, their children are often the silent sufferers. You can let them know

they aren't forgotten. Consider giving a child of a prisoner the joy

of Christmas this year.

PMUMC has been a tremendous supporter of "Angel Tree" through the years. Please be on the lookout for the Christmas tree with Angel Tags on it, in the Narthex beginning November 20<sup>th</sup>. Gifts should be returned to the church no later than December 7<sup>th</sup>, please. The party for the children will be held earlier than usual this year – it is scheduled for December 10<sup>th</sup>.

PLEASE NOTE... a gift should cost no more than \$25. There are reasons for this. Many children in the Angel Tree program are in a household with more than 1 child — so keeping gifts in the same price range is best for everyone.
