

Last month I wrote that I was unsettled and uneasy. I knew the Holy Spirit was up to something, but I couldn't say what it was. Something amazing was happening.

Now I know. It's part of a worldwide movement, and one of the nuclei is here – right here – in Peralta. God is calling us to be part of an amazing work. It's powerful and inspiring. It's terrifying and clarifying. It is the work of bringing the Kingdom of God to fruition here and now.

It is slow work. The sign beneath Jesus on the side of our Community Building says it all, "Reaching One Heart at a Time." The Holy Spirit is calling me to call all of us to make disciples – one heart at a time. It's time to vanquish those bad and ugly things. Through lives transformed, the world is transformed. May the Holy Spirit lead us to a new way of being in our community! May lives and a community transformed by God be our "Main Thing" in the year to come.

Hymn History



There Is Power in the Blood-1899

“Inasmuch as there is none like You, O Lord (You are great, and Your name is great in might.)”
Jeremiah 10:6

Both the words and music of this old hymn were written during a camp meeting at Mountain Lake Park, Maryland, by Lewis Jones. Jones, A California native, graduated from Moody Bible Institute and spent his vocational life with the Young Men’s Christian Association (YMCA). ON the side, he wrote hymns. This, his best known, is particularly effective in resisting the “wiles of the devil”

One day, as missionary Dick Hillis preached in a Chinese village, his sermon was suddenly interrupted by a piercing cry. Everyone rushed toward the scream, and Dick’s coworker, Mr. Kong, whispered that an evil spirit had seized a man. Dick, having not previously encountered demon possession, didn’t believe him. Just then, a woman rushed toward them. “I beg you help me!” she cried. “An evil spirit has again possessed the father of my children and is trying to kill him.”

The two evangelists entered the house, stepping over a filthy old dog lying in the doorway. The room was charged with a sense of evil. “An evil spirit has possessed Farmer Ho,” Kong told the onlookers. “Our God, the ‘Nothing-He-Cannot-Do One’ is more powerful than any spirit, and He can deliver this man. First, you must promise you will burn your idols and trust in Jesus, son of the Supreme Emperor”

The people nodded. Kong asked Dick to begin singing the hymn “There Is Power in the Blood.” With great hesitation, Dick began to sing, “Would you be free from your burden of sin...”

“Now,” continued Kong, “in the name of Jesus we will command the evil spirit to leave this man.” Kong began praying fervently. Suddenly the old dog in the doorway vaulted into the air, screeching, yelping, whirling in circles, and snapping wildly at his tail. Kong continued praying, and the dog abruptly dropped over dead.

Instantly Dick remembered Luke 8, the demons of the Gadarenes who invisibly flew into the herd of swine. As Kong finished praying, Farmer Ho seemed quiet and relaxed, and soon he was strong enough to burn his idols. At his baptism shortly afterward, he testified, “I was possessed by an evil spirit who boasted he had already killed five people and was going to kill me. But God sent Mr. Kong at just the right moment, and in Jesus I am free.”

We concluded our year with a wonderful Christmas party hosted by Jim Kubisak, and the next week, we went around Peralta and Bosque Farms caroling on the back of the Blaine's trailer hay-ride. Thanks Tom and Sam! We followed that up with a great annual Aftershock Christmas party and white elephant gift exchange. Then we had a lock-in (what was I thinking)? Thank you to Julieanne, Susi and Pete, Melodie and Larry, Jim, Tinka, and everyone who participated in this event with 21 youth and 3 adults spending the night and not getting much sleep. Thank you, Jesus, for every heart that has been touched by our youth and for your leading light to us in the new year.

LIGHT NIGHT IS COMING SOON, PEOPLE GET READY

Pastor David challenged me as the Youth Director, in contemplating if we are allowing God to reveal Himself to our youth. That starting me thinking of how the dynamics of our weekly youth group meetings have changed and evolved over the last ten years. While the focus has always been about Jesus in our lives, we have carried this out in many different ways according to the different needs of the youth who were attending. We have utilized evening Vesper services, video teachings, stories and lessons straight from the bible, and bible based curriculum geared for youth. In my prayer and contemplation time concerning this current challenge, I believe God is revealing a new avenue for allowing our youth, and others, the opportunity to quiet our hearts and minds, and allow the Holy Spirit to open the ears of our soul to hear God's direction, encouragement, and purpose to those who participate in "Light Night". Once every month, we will come together in the Sanctuary from 7 to 8pm on our regular Sunday youth group night, and upon entering everyone will be given a journal (theirs to keep), to write down what has touched us or encouraged us. Everyone will also pick up a book light that will be used for the night. We will find a quiet place where we can each get some one-on-one time with our Lord, and while we listen to spiritual music, we will be writing down God's word for us in our journals. The altar will be open with candles and objects that anyone who feels led may bring and leave for others to learn from or to be encouraged by. Items such as bookmarks, scriptures written or on a card, small gifts, crosses, books or pamphlets etc., that someone participating may take back to their spot and with their booklight, look up in the bible or read as God speaks to them. [We need your help in supporting us with prayer, with items to be left at the altar, and in joining us on "Light Night" as you feel called.](#) Our desire for this event is to cast all burdens before the Lord, receive His word and call in our lives, and to be encouraged and empowered in our personal and Spiritual lives. The journals are to be a source of encouragement that we may all look upon should we need encouragement or the lifting of our spirits anytime during the week, until the next "Light Night". All suggestions and ideas are welcome as we prepare for the first Light Night in January. Look for dates in the January bulletins.

OPTION FOR TITHING/GIVING to the Church

Are you interested in making your pledge – tithe – donation to the church via “Electronic Funds Transfer” on a continuing, monthly basis?

You would authorize the church to debit your bank account electronically, transferring funds to the church’s bank account per your authorization. All that is required is you completing an authorization form which is available from the Church Treasurer.

A brief overview of how this program works:

You provide permission/authorization and pertinent bank information regarding your monthly giving to the Church Treasurer. Your donation will be set up so that the church’s account will directly receive your donation, pledge, tithe from your bank account. This transfer would occur on the 7th of each month, or the closest business day following the 7th of the month. **You may cancel or stop this automatic giving at any time with a WRITTEN/SIGNED request no later than the 15th of the month before the next scheduled withdrawal transfer.** (i.e. if you want to stop the transfer in April, you would submit a written request to the Church Treasurer no later than March 15th).
