**When the days drew near for him to be taken up,  
he set his face to go to Jerusalem - Luke 9:51**

Martin Luther claimed that a person's whole attitude toward God and humanity is written on his face and that, once past thirty, a person is therefore accountable for the way his or her face looks. There is no doubt in my mind that Luther exaggerated.

But you can tell something about people by looking at their faces. Is the person sick? Look at that peaked face. Is the person worried? Look at the frown and the tight set of the jaw. Is the person old? Ashamed? Delighted? A face tells so much that a skillful actor or actress can generate the force of a whole scene just by moving a few muscles in their face.

Now let's look at the face of our Lord, set like flint to go to Jerusalem. Every line on that determined face tells us that he is on his way to die and that he knows it. Nobody will take his life from him. He will lay it down. But the coming horror causes even the son of God to grit his teeth. He will make detours, talk with the disciples, and reach out with divine love to nameless scoundrels. But always that steadfast look will be on his face. All the demonic forces are waiting up ahead. But all of God's creation is waiting too – waiting for its redemption.

What did Jesus do? When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face and he went to Jerusalem.

My hope is that during this season of Lent you and I can fathom the depth of our Lord's journey to the cross and His wondrous love that moved along the way of sorrows for the redemption of the world.

I am glad and grateful for your prayers and concerns for me. I look forward to growing in my faith and serving you as the Pastor. My sincere hope is that the voice of Scriptures comes through in your life and mine and we continue to grow in God's grace.



## JUDY CARSON MEMORIAL BOOKS MINISTRY

We have been busy ordering books, getting books from Bart and other donations. We have given over 600 books to kids in their food bags at school, and providing books for El Ranchito de Los Ninos. El Ranchito de Los Ninos is a home for siblings needing foster care. The siblings stay there until they can find foster care that will take all the siblings so they don't have to be separated. This is a new place where we are furnishing books. We took the first delivery recently, and they were so happy to get the books. They told me the kids all love to read. It is a good thing to keep their minds on something else besides what is going on in their family. It was such a pleasure to meet the people there and be able to furnish books for those kids.

We have also given the teachers at Peralta Elementary some new books for their classrooms. We would like to do the same for the other school we help with books. Teachers have to buy all their own books for their classrooms, so we tried to help them out with a couple of new books for their rooms.

Most of us think kids don't read anymore, but I am finding out a lot of kids in Valencia County don't have a book to read except at school. Some of these kids would love a book to read. I know a lot of kids have electronic books and love them, but some kids aren't that fortunate. If you love to read you will understand what it is like to not have a book to read. I love to read, and can't believe how many people, especially kids, don't have a book of their own.

Judy's passion was for every kid to be able to read and have a book of their own. If you have this passion for your kids and grandkids, we have a reading room in the fellowship hall where you can get a book, bring it or another book back to pass on to someone else. Please visit the room with your kids is the only rule. We are a safe sanctuary so you must be with your children. There will always be books in boxes to deliver so I ask that you do not take books from those boxes. The shelves are full of great new books.
