Going Beyond Our Walls to Build God's Kingdom

Inclusion and Belonging

Since a church like ours is already committed to the value of inclusion in our dealings with others, let me suggest that there is a world of difference between inclusion and belonging. The problem with affirming that ours is a fully inclusive church is that the people who may receive a friendly greeting from us on Sunday morning may in fact be experiencing inclusion without at the same time feeling any real, strong sense of belonging. Just because you are allowed to take up space in a room does not in and of itself provide a guarantee that anybody else actually loves you.

Earlier this week listening to a podcast I heard theologian John Swinton from the United Kingdom tell the story of an elderly woman from his congregation who regularly attends weekly worship and the tea and coffee time of fellowship that follows. While she was always made to feel perfectly welcome by the other parishioners for that hour-and-a-half of worship and social exchange every Sunday, she had come to understand that her only friendships with these other congregants lasted precisely ninety minutes each week. For the rest of the week she lived alone in silence, for nobody bothered to call on her or check on her welfare. As Swinton pointed out, she is fully included in the life of her church, but she does not really yet belong. And she will not finally belong to that church until the moment that the fact of her physical presence or absence as part of the Body of Christ becomes a truly personal concern to somebody else. Simply being allowed into the room does not mean that you are really loved. Honest love always requires that someone else actually gives a rip whether or not you are around.

Here's the deal: I want you to commit yourselves to demonstrate in very personal, tangible ways that you will be useful to God in helping bring others to a full sense of belonging within our own family of faith. I don't expect that the process will always feel comfortable and convenient, for helping someone come to know that they are actually loved and not merely tolerated in my life and family and will usually require me to take pains to demonstrate that fact. And perhaps that is always the problem for those of us who have been called to follow Jesus. For as happy as Jesus might one day be to welcome me to the magnificent place he has been preparing all of these years, I suspect he will still think to ask me that one eternal question: Where are all the others?


Crafty Ladies would like donations of picture frames 8x10 or 9x12; wood only please (no metal).



FEEDING CHILDRENS' MINDS AND STOMACHES

According to this article in the Albuquerque Journal 70% schools in NM are title 1 schools. According to this article there are a lot of disadvantaged kids in New Mexico. As we all know, kids cannot learn well on an empty stomach. As you can see kids that are disadvantaged are not reading at the level they should be. According to the article the largest negative home-influenced factor is a lack of exposure to the printed word. The absence of books and other reading material in the homes is a huge factor in kids reading at level. There are other determents in homes of disadvantaged kids such as no school supplies, no breakfast, no utilities, and many others. This is a large problem in New Mexico and Valencia County. These children need our help. **IF NOT US WHO. According to the article 85.2% schools in NM are title one schools. 70.9% get free or reduced lunches. We have to help these children**

As most of you know, we have been giving away free books to kids for a couple of years. Last year we gave over 700 books. This year we will be giving books to teachers for their rooms. The first books ordered arrived today, and will be distributed this week. We will also continue to send books home in food bags through the schools. We also give Grace Church books for their Wednesday night dinner to persons that are needing help. We will continue to do all we did last year plus giving to the teachers. We hope to give out close to a thousand books this year. Bart also gives me books through his organization Read With Me.

We are also giving snacks to kids at Century High School. Century is an alternative school which needs our help with a lot of things. The snacks are given to teachers who give them to kids that come to school with no breakfast and some with no dinner the night before.

On Saturday, August 20, 2022 four art-glass windows were presented to Fr. Robert for St. Matthews Episcopal Church.

The windows were originally requested by Warren Janke of Peralta Methodist's "Crash-Glass-Gals" for St. Matthews church. They depict traditional Episcopal emblems representing the apostles St. Matthew, St. Mark, St. Luke, and St. John. Warren's support of this project is appreciated. We were saddened at his passing prior to the completion of the project. We were happy that Regina Janke was able to be with us for the presentation.

The "Crash-Glass-Gals" - Pam Eppers, Susan Reese, Naomi Jordan, and Sylvia Regelbrugge, had continued to work on art glass projects after the art glass windows for the sanctuary in Peralta Methodist were completed. The art glass pieces made use of recycled tempered glass (such as from shower doors), and ground glass from the Los Lunas Glass Recycling facility. While the project took longer than anticipated due to Covid, and some health issues, the "Crash-Glass-Gals" agree that it was an enjoyable and uplifting project.
