Going Beyond Our Walls to Build God's Kingdom

Pastor's Message

<u>Make</u> every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. Ephesians 4:3-6

Variety is often a treasure. An old fashioned garden presents a splendid variety of grasses, ferns, and flowers. A well-stocked grocery store has a wide variety of food with fruits and vegetables in an array of sizes, shapes, and colors. All this is a sign of God's goodness, said John Calvin. We could have gotten along with just a few kinds of foods and flowers. But God wants to delight us.

Yet God made only one church. Christians believe there is *one* "holy catholic church." Here it is we, and not God, who have introduced variety. I mean that God is not the one who has splintered the church into pieces that are indifferent or hostile to each other. One God has called one people to be one body. It is we who have divided the body.

The divisions keep on across the centuries, across the world. America by itself has hundreds of varieties of churches. Some of the variety is just fine. Local churches, for example, can organize for particular missions. But some of the variety is owed to sinful division. Christians are supposed to be one body, visibly. But we are not. And our divisions are a scandal before the face of heaven and earth. Schism, the breach of union in the church, is a tragedy, like divorce, painful tearing apart of the body. Doctrine, communion, ordination of women, views of homosexuality, even whether to sing one hymn or a praise song – and all these issues have become blades that cut the membrane of unity.

But what can we do? Do we declare ourselves alone to be right and invite all others to be converted to us? Or give up our own confession and practice just because other Christians reject it? NO.

Could we perhaps, begin by trying to keep the unity of Spirit in the local church to which we now belong?

Forgive us, O God, for grieving you with our divisions. Forgive our church sin. Forgive, correct, and heal us by your Spirit. Amen.
